

Jeanne Clery Disclosure of Campus Security and Campus Crime Statistics Act (1990)

(adapted from Middleburys' "Clery Study Abroad Location Statistics Request to Local Law Enforcement")

According to the Jeanne Clery Disclosure of Campus Security and Campus Crime Statistics Act (1990), which is a U.S. federal law applicable to postsecondary schools that receive federal funds from the U.S. government, certain Schools Abroad programs are required to gather and disclose crime reports and statistics in an Annual Security Report and a Web-based data collection.

Specifically, institutions are required to gather and disclose statistics for certain reported crimes that occurred on property that: (a) an institution owns or controls; (b) is used for the institution's educational purposes; and (c) is frequently used by students. Institutions are required to disclose statistics regarding crimes that are reported to the institution, as well as to disclose crime statistics provided to the institution by local law enforcement agencies.

The offenses that we are seeking statistics about are as follows:

- Murder/Non-negligent Manslaughter
- Negligent Manslaughter
- Sex Offenses-forcible (i.e., forcible rape, forcible sodomy, sexual assault with an object, and forced fondling)
- Sex Offenses-non-forcible (i.e., statutory rape and incest)
- Robbery
- Burglary
- Aggravated Assault
- Motor Vehicle Theft
- Arson
- Domestic Violence
- Dating Violence
- Stalking

Please specify if any of the above-listed offenses were categorized as **hate crimes**. *In addition to the crimes above, please include statistics for any incidents of larceny-theft, simple assault, intimidation, or destruction/damage/vandalism of property that were classified as hate crimes.* We also need the category of bias for each hate crime according to the six categories we are required to report: race, gender, religion, sexual orientation, ethnicity/national origin, and disability.

The definitions for the above-referenced crimes, as provided in the Uniform Crime Reporting system and regulations that we are required to use, are attached.

Please also include statistics for **arrests**, only for the following categories:

Middlebury C.V. Starr School in Germany

- Liquor Law Violations
- Drug Abuse Violations
- Weapons: Carrying, Possessing, Etc.

Annual Security Report must be published by October 1st of each year.
